PUT ON YOUR GARMENT OF PRAISE

2 Chronicles 20:22; And when they began to sing and to praise, the LORD set ambushments against the children of Ammon, Moab, and mount Seir, which were come against Judah; and they were smitten.

Joshua 6:20; So the people shouted when the priests blew with the trumpets: and it came to pass, when the people heard the sound of the trumpet, and the people shouted with a great shout, that the wall fell down flat, so that the people went up into the city, every man straight before him, and they took the city.

THE BIBLE IS FULL of stories that showcase the transformative power of praise. Time and time again, you would have read of people who faced insurmountable problems and yet against all odds they overcame with the weapon of praise. We see it in the life of Paul and Silas, Joshua, Jehoshaphat and even the great patriarch Abraham who was struggling to see the fulfillment of God's promises in his life:

Romans 4: 20 He staggered not at the promise of God through unbelief; but was strong in faith, giving glory to God.

Giving glory and praise to God rejuvenated and revitalized an old impotent body and a dead barren womb to bring forth the promised seed. You will notice when you read these particular stories that their divine instruction was simply to sing, praise, dance or shout.

How can a simple thing like praising, singing, shouting and dancing bring victory?

How can a simple thing like praising, singing, shouting and dancing do so much damage in the kingdom of darkness?

It boggles the mind to imagine that engaging praise to God can actually provoke breakthroughs, personal breakthroughs, health breakthroughs, financial breakthroughs and open doors but nonetheless it does. It sounds foolish and too simplistic because many of us are like Naaman the leper who was given a simple instruction to go dip himself in the River Jordan to receive his healing. He flew into a fit of rage saying, 'I thought, the prophet would surely come out to me, and stand, and call on the name of the LORD his God, and strike his hand here and there and all over the place for me to recover from leprosy.'(2 Kings 5:11) Thank God he had some wise servants who advised him, 'Father, if the prophet had asked you to do something hard and heroic, wouldn't you have done it? So why not this simple 'wash and be clean'?'(2 Kings 5:13)



The mystery of praise is that a simple thing like engaging God in praise wreaks havoc in the kingdom of darkness. If you knew the potency of praise, you would not be silent in church nor in the privacy of your home. Praise is one of the most simple and potent weapons of faith that satan hates. This is why we call it the mystery of praise.

My duty as a minister as well as all other ministers is to unveil divine mysteries so that the believer can apply his faith to his life to enforce victory.

1 Corinthians 4:1 This, then, is how you ought to regard us: as servants of Christ and as those entrusted with the mysteries God has revealed. – New International Version

A mystery in the secular world is often defined as something obscure, hidden and beyond the reach of understanding. It is not so in the Scriptures. A mystery is a simple and divine secret that once the believer grasps it secures progression, expansion, and protection.

Jesus said to the disciples, Unto you it is given to know the mystery of the kingdom of God... (Mark 4:11) therefore mysteries are freely given to the believer in the Scriptures and by the leading of the Spirit in order for us to live a life of victory.

Unlike the world where a mystery is beyond the reach of understanding, in the Bible it is the key to victory and mastery that will make a mockery of every deadly demonic plan. Jehoshaphat's tiny nation of Judah made a mockery of a conglomerate of three nations that came to destroy them. Through their praise, God set ambushment and confusion in the camp of the enemy

causing them to turn on their own selves destroying one another. The mystery of praise in Jehoshaphat, Joshua at Jericho and Paul is that praise gives the righteous mastery and victory over the world, the flesh and the devil. It will make a mockery of the plan of satan.

The prophet Isaiah prophesied of the accomplished works of the Messiah:

Isaiah 61:1 The Spirit of the Lord GOD is upon me; because the LORD hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek... ³To appoint unto them that mourn in Zion, to give unto them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they might be called trees of righteousness, the planting of the LORD, that he might be glorified.

Notice the Messiah who we know is Jesus will give us beauty for ashes, the oil of joy and the garment of praise.

Garments identify people. Bartimaeus wore a cloak that identified him as a blind man and a leper wore a leper garment. The high priest had his specific garment that made him stand out and of course a king would be defined by his royal robe. Joseph was known for his coat of many colors that drove his brothers to jealousy and betrayal.

The clothes we wear every day are our choice, and similarly, the spiritual and emotional garment or mantle we put on is also a choice. Are you wearing a 'garment of praise', filled with joy and thanksgiving, or a 'garment of sackcloth and ashes', weighed down by sorrow and despair? Some believers are wrapped in a 'garment of worry' or a 'garment of fear'. Some are in the sackcloth of regret and grief but I choose to put on the garment of praise. What 'garment' will you wear today?

Are you wearing the garments of praise

or sackcloth and ashes? There is a very clear choice and a clear decision to be made.

Psalm 30: 11 Thou hast turned for me my mourning into dancing: thou hast put off my sackcloth, and girded me with gladness; 12 To the end that my glory may sing praise to thee, and not be silent. O LORD my God, I will give thanks unto thee for ever.

Put on your garment of praise and God will turn your mourning into dancing. Take off the sackcloth of sadness and God will gird you with gladness.

As Joshua and the people shouted and the wall of Jericho came down, shout and your walls will come down.

As Jehoshaphat's Judah praised and there was confusion in the camp of the enemy, praise and let confusion overtake your enemy.


As Paul and Silas praised and all the doors were opened, give God praise in your place of confinement and all the doors will be opened to you.

Since God is no respecter of persons. If he did it for them, he will do it for you!

The marvel of intercessorial tongues is that you do not have to rely upon someone else to pray for you: the Holy Spirit does it through you and for you

TONGUES IS HITTING THE BULL'S EYE

Romans 8:26 Likewise the Spirit also helpeth our infirmities: for we know not what we should pray for as we ought: but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered. ²⁷And he that searcheth the hearts knoweth what is the mind of the Spirit, because he maketh intercession for the saints according to the will of God. ²⁸And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.

Romans 8:26 is one of my favorite verses, if not my favorite verse in the Bible. It is one of the main reasons I pray in tongues all the time. This verse is about prayer and more specifically the Spirit's ability and prowess in prayer. When Paul engaged the words 'likewise the Spirit helps our infirmities' he is including himself in the scenario of ultimate human weakness: the inability to pray conveniently or aptly about a dire situation.

Maybe you've experienced a situation that rendered you helpless and you didn't even know how to approach it in prayer. You've been there... and I have been there! That is exactly what Paul is referring to. The great apostle Paul, who taught us so much about prayer, informed us that he himself sometimes does not even know what to begin with in prayer. But what looked like the ultimate weakness is turned into the ultimate help, for you see, 'but the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered...' Or as one rendition goes, 'the Spirit himself

maketh intercession for us with inarticulate speech.' What does that mean? Well, when you speak in your natural language, you articulate from your mind through your mouth the words you want to convey. But when you pray in tongues, the Spirit articulates from your *spirit* man through your mouth in tongues - or inarticulate *speech* – that is *not* understood by the mind. The marvel of intercessorial tongues is that it is the Holy Spirit praying for you through you. This means you do not have to rely upon someone else to pray for you: the Holy Spirit does it through you and for you. It does not get any better than that... or does it? It sure does!


'But the Spirit itself maketh intercession for us with groanings which cannot be uttered.' Notice these words, 'the Spirit himself maketh intercession'. The word intercession in Greek is huperentugchano. This is the only time that this word is used in the entire New Testament and it has several meanings:

ADVOCATE PRESENTING AND PLEADING YOUR CASE

It refers to someone acting as an advocate, such as a lawyer in a courtroom. The reason we have a lawyer is to present our case to win. They know all the laws and all the accusations the prosecuting attorney will use to counteract. No one is more prepared to present and plead your case for your victory than the Holy Spirit. Through tongues, you experience the advocacy of the Spirit.

TONGUES IS FULL SCALE RESCUE OPERATION

Secondly, this word *huperentugchano* paints the picture of someone who has come upon a person who has fallen into some kind of quandary, as though they have



fallen into a deep cavern and are stuck. There is someone who immediately swings into action to rescue and deliver the one who is in trouble. It conveys the idea of a full scale rescue operation.

When we do not know how we should pray for that situation, the Holy Spirit swings into a full-scale rescue operation. But in order to do this, He jumps into that place with you. You are no longer facing that situation alone, for the Holy Spirit has stepped into your dilemma and is initiating a rescue plan to get you out of that mess. The Holy Spirit feels *everything* that you feel. He understands the complete inadequacy you are experiencing. He willingly joins you in your circumstances, sharing your emotions and frustrations. Then He begins to put a supernatural plan of rescue into operation to get you out of that problem.

HITTING THE TARGET

Thirdly, *huperentugchano* is a Greek word that paints a vivid picture of an arrow hitting its target. Let's break it down:

- ὑπέρ (huper) means "over" or "beyond"
- ἐv (en) means "in" or "within"
- τυγχανω (tugchano) means "to hit" or "to strike"

Together, *huperentugchano* creates a dynamic image of an arrow flying straight and true, hitting its mark with precision and


power. It is as if the arrow is "hitting beyond" or "striking over" the target, implying a sense of exceeding expectations or going above and beyond. In ancient Greek, this word was used to describe a range of concepts, including:

- *Physical accuracy*, like an archer hitting their target;
- *Spiritual precision*, like a prayer or worship hitting its mark in the heavens:
- *Emotional resonance*, like a message or gesture striking a chord in someone's heart.

Huperentugchano carries a sense of focus, intention, and accomplishment. It's a powerful metaphor for achieving our goals, hitting our targets, and making a meaningful impact in the world around us.

When I was growing up in London, England, playing darts was (and still is) a very popular activity. The championship players were household names and there was even a very popular TV gameshow called Bullseye. But when we played darts, we were hitting all over the board; everywhere except the bullseye! That is how our prayer life is without the Holy Spirit and tongues.

Isn't it marvelous to know that you can always hit the target when you pray in tongues for it is the Holy Spirit praying *for* you *through* you!



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Sarah was 90 year's old when she gave birth. Abraham was 100. That took some faith! I think that's a mother of faith!

WHAT DO WE KNOW ABOUT OT TOO MUCH! She was the wife of Abraham. She was the mother of

What else? She laughed when she heard that God was going to make her a mother in her old age.

She told her husband to go and sleep with her servant and get her pregnant!

That doesn't sound so good.

What else?

...And here we struggle...

But we do know much more about her husband Abraham? God chose Abraham. and made him a promise to be father of a great nation. Lets look at the story of Abraham and Sarah.

Romans 4 talks about Abraham the Old Testament **patriarch**.

We hear about Abraham's faith in God's promise of blessing him through Abraham's seed. This promised "seed" would come about through a son, whom he and Sarah would have.

Genesis 15:5: He took him outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them."

Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

Genesis 15:6; Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness.

We see here that God didn't just promise Abraham offspring, but he promised him as many as the stars in the sky!

In Romans 3:1-8 we find out... Abraham was justified by faith alone.

It's all about faith, having faith in God and in His Word, or in other words, "faith in the faithfulness of God!"

Genesis 12:1-7; Now the Lord had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and



father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

²And I will make of thee a great nation, and I will bless thee, and make thy name great; and thou shalt be a blessing: ³And I will bless them that bless thee, and curse him that curseth thee: and in thee shall all families of the earth be blessed. 4So Abram departed, as the Lord had spoken unto him; and Lot went with him: and Abram was seventy and five years old when he departed out of Haran. ⁵And Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan; and into the land of Canaan they came. ⁶And Abram passed through the land unto the place of Sichem, unto the plain of Moreh. And the Canaanite was then in the land. ⁷And **the** Lord appeared unto Abram, and said, Unto thy seed will I give this land: and there builded he an altar unto the Lord, who appeared unto him.

Let's recap so far, God has promised Abram seed (descendants) and land.

- 1. God gave instruction: leave this land
- **2. God made a promise**: I will make you a great nation
- 3. Abram obeyed: he departed!

NB: It was a conditional promise. God promised to bless Abraham IF Abraham did something (obey him).

We know Abraham believed God and it was counted to him as righteousness, but notice Abraham didn't JUST believe... he obeved!!

He acted on Gods instruction. We know faith without works is dead...

James 2:17 In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is

Since Abraham is known as the 'Father of Faith' my question is ...

Is Sarah the mother of faith??

Think about it: Abraham believed God's promise that he would be the father of a nation, even though he and Sarah were both old and she was barren.

He believed (had faith) then acted on it! But he couldn't do this ALONE. He needed the cooperation of his wife Sarah. So let's look at Sarah:

Genesis 12:1 Now the Lord had said unto Abram, Get thee out of thy country, and from thy kindred, and from thy father's house, unto a land that I will shew thee:

Think about this...

Abram was seventy-five years old when he set out from Harran.

Sarah was 10 years younger, therefore she

Genesis 12:5 Abram took Sarai his wife, and Lot his brother's son, and all their substance that they had gathered, and the souls that they had gotten in Haran; and they went forth to go into the land of Canaan:

They had to pack up everything they had and leave their home and travel. If you've ever had to pack up everything and move home you know it's not easy and not fun!

There were no big trucks or moving **companies**. The journey would have been uncomfortable.

In Genesis 12:1 God told him to go unto a land that I will shew thee:

They didn't know where they were going! Can you Imagine? They also didn't know how long it was going to take!

In Genesis 12:5 we find out ... Abram took Sara his wife... My big question is: *did they discuss it beforehand?*

Imagine the discussion between Sarah and Abraham:

"Where are we going?" I don't

"Why are we going?" Because God

"How long will it take?" I don't

Ladies, how would you feel about

Another question I have is, *How much* time was there between Genesis 1:1 and Genesis 1:4? In verse 1, God told Abraham to go, and in verse 4 Abraham went!

When we moved to USA we had been thinking about it and talking about it for years. Waiting, planning, doing what we needed to do, then packing etc. It wasn't easy, wasn't fun, there were lots of emotions, we were leaving family and friends behind, there was uncertainty and we were unsure of what was ahead...but we did what we thought God wanted us to do. It was an act of faith and it was NOT easy!

I don't know what place in life you are right now but sometimes you have to step out in faith, take some big steps, some bold steps IF and WHEN God tells you to. They aren't always the steps YOU want to take, not always the place you WANT to go but you have to trust God and his PLAN. This is living by FAITH and walking in faith.

Did Abraham want to leave his home? Did Sarah? Probably not!

Aren't you glad they did? Aren't you glad Abraham **stepped out in faith?** Aren't you glad Sarah went along with the plan?

Praise God!!



Genesis 12:11-20 tells us the story of what happened when they went to Egypt:

Genesis 12:11-20: As he was about to enter Egypt, he said to his wife Sarai, "I know what a beautiful woman you are. ¹²When the Egyptians see you, they will say, 'This is his wife.' Then they will kill me but will let you live. ¹³Say you are my sister, so that I will be treated well for your sake and my life will be spared because of you." 14 When Abram came to Egypt, the Egyptians saw that Sarai was a very beautiful woman. 15And when

Pharaoh's officials saw her, they praised her to Pharaoh, and she was taken into his palace. ¹⁶He treated Abram well for her sake. and Abram acquired sheep and cattle, male and female donkeys, male and female servants, and camels. 17But the Lord inflicted serious diseases on Pharaoh and his household because of Abram's wife Sarai. ¹⁸So Pharaoh summoned Abram. "What have you done to me?" he said. "Why didn't you tell me she was your wife? 19Why did you say, 'She is my sister,' so that I took her to be my wife? Now then, here is your wife. Take her and go!" 20 Then Pharaoh gave orders about Abram to his men, and they sent him on his way, with his wife and everything he had.

> Remember this was Abraham's decision for them to go to Egypt and for Sarah to say what she said about being his sister.

Notice we don't hear Sarah's opinion, or know if she said anything. Sometimes as wives we don't understand our husbands decisions but we understand that as the head of the house/head of the wife he has been given by God the responsibility to make decisions.

I'm not saying wives can't talk or give our opinion, thoughts or suggestions but we need to respect the head, pray they make the right decisions and trust God, just as Sarah did.

In Genesis 15 the Lord made a promise and a covenant with Abraham:

Genesis 15:4-6; Then the word of the Lord came to him: "This man will not be your heir, but a son who is your own flesh and blood will be your heir." ⁵He took him outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring[d] be." ⁶Abram believed the Lord, and he credited it to him as righteousness.

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Genesis 16:1-2; Now Sarai, Abram's wife, had borne him no children. But she had an Egyptian slave named Hagar; 2so she said to Abram, "The Lord has kept me from having children. Go, sleep with my slave; perhaps I can build a family through her."

Ladies we do and say stupid things sometimes! Men you do and say stupid things sometimes too! But God is merciful, and hopefully the people who see your mistakes will be merciful.

Genesis 16:3-5; Abram agreed to what Sarai said. ³So after Abram had been living in Canaan ten years, Sarai his wife took her Egyptian slave Hagar and gave her to her husband to be his wife. 4He slept with Hagar, and she conceived. When she (Hagar) knew she was pregnant, she began to despise her mistress. 5Then Sarai said to Abram, "You are responsible for the wrong **Iam suffering**. I put my slave in your arms, and now that she knows she is pregnant, she despises me. May the Lord judge between you and me."

My question is who was responsible? Who was to blame?

This reminds me of Adam and Eve in the Garden. Eve took the apple but Adam did not stop her from eating it.

Sarah made a suggestion, but Abraham didn't have to go along with it.

Why didn't Adam remind Eve of God's instructions to them not to eat the apple?

Why didn't Abraham remind Sarah of the covenant God had made with him: the promises of descendants like stars of the sky (Genesis 15:5)? He took him outside and said, "Look up at the sky and count the stars—if indeed you can count them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be."

Clearly neither Abraham or Sarah were perfect. Yet Abraham is known as the Father of faith. It's not your perfection that makes you righteous, it's your faith!

I asked you at the beginning, if Abraham is the *father of faith* is Sarah the *mother of* faith?

We find the answer here:

Genesis 17:15-16; God also said to Abraham, "As for Sarai your wife, you are no longer to call her Sarai; her name will be

Sarah. 16I will bless her and will surely give vou a son by her. I will bless her so that she will be the mother of nations; kings of peoples will come from her."

Read verse 16 again, "I will bless her and will surely give you a son by her. I will bless her so that she will be the mother of nations; kings of peoples will come from

In chapter 18, Abraham had 3 visitors:

Genesis 18:9-10; "Where is your wife Sarah?" they asked him. "There, in the tent," he said. 10 Then one of them said, "I will surely return to you about this time next year, and Sarah your wife will have a son."

Now, Sarah was listening at the entrance to the tent, which was behind him.

Genesis 18:11-14: Abraham and Sarah were already very old, and Sarah was past the age of childbearing. 12So Sarah laughed to herself as she thought, "After I am worn out and my lord is old, will I now have this pleasure?" ¹³Then the Lord said to Abraham, "Why did Sarah laugh and say, 'Will I really have a child, now that I am old?' 14 Is anything too hard for the Lord? I will return to you at the appointed time next vear, and Sarah will have a son."

Notice, both Sara and Abram laughed at God's promise to them. Sometimes it's not easy to believe Gods promises; they don't always make sense. But our job is not to understand God but to believe God!

Genesis 21:1-5; Now the Lord was gracious to Sarah as he had said, and the Lord did for Sarah what he had promised. ²Sarah became pregnant and

bore a son to Abraham in his old age, at the very time God had promised *him.* ³*Abraham gave the name Isaac to the* son Sarah bore him. ⁴When his son Isaac was eight days old, Abraham circumcised him, as God commanded him. 5Abraham was a hundred years old when his son Isaac was born to him.

Sarah was 90 year's old when she gave birth! Abraham was 100. That took some faith! I think that's a mother of faith!

Remember God's promise to Abraham in Genesis 22v18: And in thy seed shall all the nations of the earth be blessed; because thou hast obeyed my voice.

Abraham **planted** a seed but Sarah had to carry that seed in her, let it grow, give birth to it, go through all the changes in her body – when she was 90! That took some faith!

I think it's fair to call her the *mother of*

Genesis 23:1; Sarah lived to be a hundred and twenty-seven years old. ²She died at Kiriath Arba (that is, Hebron) in the land of Canaan, and Abraham went to mourn for Sarah and to weep over her.

You don't have to be perfect: you have to have faith in God! God has made so many promises to us his children. He has many blessings for his children.

As the seed of Abraham AND Sarah - we have the blessing of Abraham - that we are made righteous by faith, not by works.

The act of Jesus on the cross and your faith in what He did for you on the cross makes you righteous – Praise God!

Choose to have faith like Sarah... Faith in the faithfulness of God!



Prayer Coach - Prayer of the righteous

No more fear in my life

EAR IS NOT GOD'S will for your life. Fear is the attraction to the spirit of destruction. Paul said to Timothy, his spiritual son when he was going through a difficult time in his ministry, that God is not the author of fear and that fear does not come from God. Instead. Paul reveals the source of this evil force: it is a demon. Paul told Timothy, 'For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.' (2 Timothy 1:7) Understand that fear, anxiety, worry, and panic are not from God, but spirits that torment God's people, as well as the people in the world. Fear is a pandemic that attacks and plagues everyone, but God has a solution for the spirit of fear. You do not have to be a victim of this spirit. You can be free from the paralyzing thoughts of fear, as well as the spirit of fear itself.

MEDITATION

- 2 Timothy 1:7 For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.
- Isaiah 26:3 Thou shalt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee, because he trusteth in thee.
- Philippians 4:6 Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. ⁷And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.
- 1 Peter 5:7 Casting all your care upon him; for he careth for you. ⁸Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour.
- Job 3:25 For the thing which I greatly feared is come upon me, and that which I was afraid of is come unto me.

Fear and faith are opposing forces that use the same principle to achieve results

Fear or dread is the opposite of faith. They operate on the same principle of believing and receiving or anticipating a certain outcome. The law of faith believes and receives the best from God while the law of fear believes and receives the worst from Satan. Faith activates the hand of God while fear activates the hand of Satan. Notice that Job said, 'For the thing which I greatly feared is come upon me, and that which I was afraid of is come unto me.' Then Jesus said to the centurion and the Syrophoenician woman, 'Great is your faith'. So we see a case of great fear and great faith, but they were both received from a different source. One comes from God for our good and the other from Satan for our evil.

DEFINITION OF FEAR

An unpleasant emotion caused by the belief that someone or something is dangerous, likely to cause pain, or a threat.

- A feeling of anxiety concerning the outcome of something or the safety and well-being of someone.
- The likelihood that something bad will happen.
- A mixed feeling of terror and reverence.
- A sense of unease about possible danger.
- A sense of impending loss and impending doom.
- A sentiment of loss of control.

Fear begins as a thought from the outside seeking entrance to the inside.

You have to deal with fear at the thought level because it is easier than dealing with fear when it is inside you. It is much easier to keep something out of you than to get it out of you.

All fear is a fear of loss and death which causes great torment and subjects one to bondage throughout one's lives

Hebrews 2:14 Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he also himself likewise took part of the same; that through death he might destroy him that had the power of death, that is, the devil; ¹⁵And deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage.

Fear, in its final analysis, is paralysis. It paralyzes all forward movement making you stuck with nowhere to go.

Fear is contagious

- Deuteronomy 20:8 And the officers shall speak further unto the people, and they shall say, What man is there that is fearful and fainthearted? let him go and return unto his house, lest his brethren's heart faint as well as his heart.
- Isaiah 7:1 And it came to pass in the days of Ahaz the son of Jotham, the son of Uzziah, king of Judah, that Rezin the king of Syria, and Pekah the son of Remaliah, king of Israel, went up toward Jerusalem to war against it, but could not prevail against it. ²And it was told the house of David, saying, Syria is confederate with Ephraim. And his heart was moved, and the heart of his people, as the trees of the wood are moved with the wind.

Fear is ensnarement and an entrapment

- Proverbs 29:25 The fear of man bringeth a snare:but whoso putteth his trust in the Lord shall be safe.
- Isaiah 24:17 Fear, and the pit, and the snare, are upon thee, O inhabitant of the

earth. ¹⁸And it shall come to pass, that he who fleeth from the noise of the fear shall fall into the pit; and he that cometh up out of the midst of the pit shall be taken in the snare:for the windows from on high are open, and the foundations of the earth do shake.

Yielding to fear and intimidation is yielding to satan and giving him access to your life

God can do nothing for you without faith and satan can do nothing to you without fear, worry and unbelief.

Fear and **satan** go together just like **faith** and **God** go together

- Hebrews 11:6 But without faith it is impossible to please him:for he that cometh to God must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him.
- Faith pleases God, fear pleases Satan.
- Faith is a force of positivity, fear is a force of negativity.
- Faith conquers, fear cowers.

Fear and **worry** are the destructive twins of the devil

These evil twins will bring destruction into your life. Do not give in to them. The antidote to fear, as to all evil forces, is the Word of God and prayer.

So from now on, do not tolerate fear in your life because fear tolerated is faith contaminated. Do not tolerate fear in your thoughts and do not allow the spirit of fear to enter you and become a stronghold.

⁴(For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) ⁵Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ; ⁶And having in a readiness to revenge all disobedience, when your obedience is fulfilled.

CONFESSIONS TO STOP FEAR

God has not given me a spirit of fear, but of power, love and a sound mind. I decree and declare that fear is not my portion and can no longer influence my life.

Jehovah Sabaoth, Lord of the armies of angels, rise up and decapitate this Goliath of fear that seeks to invade my life.

Spirit of fear, I resist you in the name of Jesus and I forbid you to influence my life whether it be through tormenting thoughts or a spirit of fear.

Jesus said, in my name you will cast out demons, so I cast you out spirit of fear in Jesus name. Now bow down, crawl and leave.

I refuse to accept and operate in fear in my

life, I uproot it in the name of Jesus.

I resist all thoughts of fear and cast them out in the name of Jesus. I dislodge thoughts of fear and torment in the name of Jesus. All thoughts of fear and failure, now disappear in the name that is above every name.

I bind the spirit of fear, the fear of man and people, I uproot that spirit of fear, in the name of Jesus.

Fear, loose me now and let me go. I do not belong to you.

At this very moment, I bind and destroy all demonic powers that try to take control of my mind, my thoughts and my heart, I dismantle them in the name of Jesus Christ.

I declare and decree that my mind is covered and my sleep is covered by the Blood of Christ and that his angels are around me to protect me.

I decree and declare that I walk in the spirit of faith and not in the spirit of fear.


Fear is under my feet. The spirit of fear is under my feet. The thoughts of fear are under my feet.
